Representing Assembly District 24, Weprin has devoted his life to public service and making government more efficient. As

President and CEO of Marketing Works, Gold has led major branding and public relations campaigns for nonprofit organizations across New York City and Long Island that serve an array of people with special needs. Limiti's distinguished career in human services spans more than four decades at OPWDD where she touched and supported the lives of thousands throughout her tenure. She was also instrumental in the development of the Medicaid Service Coordination system and the closure of the Brooklyn Development Center

As a Home Depot manager, Delia has provided vocational opportunities for Human First's Day Habilitation Program participants, helping them to acquire customer service skills while providing opportunities for increased socialization. During the gala, John, a participant of Human First's Supported Employment Program, shared his journey of becoming part of Home Depot's workforce and the positive impact it has had on his life.

John's heartwarming story exemplified this year's gala theme, Metamorphosis, and the transformative journeys that are possible with outstanding care and support. An additional highlight of the evening was an inspirational musical performance by individuals from the Foster Avenue Choir, Human First's Brooklyn Day Habilitation Program. Fabulous food, DJ entertainment and dancing capped off a wonderful evening of recognition and celebration.

Human First Awarded Generous Grants from Staples




Human First is the recipient of two grants from Staples Foundation totaling \$1,000. The first \$500 grant will be used to provide staff training at various employment locations, educating employees on working with developmentally disabled populations and the importance of fostering an inclusive workplace to create accessible workforce development.

The second grant will be used to subsidize travel training of individuals in our Supported Employment Program. As they commute to and from work on their own using public transportation, individuals will have the opportunity to feel more empowered while achieving the highest level of independence.

Business Advisory Council Meeting Yields New Connections



On September 13, 2017, Human First's Business Advisory Council held a successful breakfast at our Pride Center in Farmingdale. The goal of the meeting was to gather feedback from council members - all Long Island business owners - on further steps needed for training and development to arm individuals with the vocational skills needed to enter the workforce. Other topics covered included strengthening support for the agency's Long Island programs (particularly areas that are currently unfunded), as well as connecting with new businesses open to hiring individuals with developmental disabilities.

During the meeting, Human First made several new community connections, such as teaming up with a local library to donate books to the Pride Center. Further discussion took place about soliciting contributions for the Pride Center's computer lab in order to equip the participants with the appropriate tools they need for success.
